





SUNSET OR SUNRISE?

"The homosexual communities of the world need to organize and activate a cultural preservation plan. We need to arrange for an international funding organization that would keep tabs on all the cultural collections, both private and public. This organization, with its international recognition, will garner the respect needed so that gays and their corporate friends will be contributing en bloc!"

This was my statement — to come to alert status — that I sent out to a dozen fellow collections, collections and collections worldwide. It spread a ripple soon to be forgotten.

The model for the Foundation is a good one. It isn't in competition with commercial galleries, it encourages them. It is always willing to inform interested parties on how to find specific artists. We do our best to not censor the artists in their expressions. We preserve that which has been already created. We do our best to protect art and artist from discouraging forces, enabling them to develop, and for the arts to flourish.

The case is actually simple. SEX. The arts organizations that provide grants still with rare exceptions do not like to have their names associated with Sex. For all these years we have been here because we knew there was purpose and reason for the presence of an arts organization that does what we do. So where do we go from here?

Either the gay community embraces the gem that we are, and rallies to our cause so we can grow and develop and empower our artists — or we go away and become a archive for studies on gueer and sexual culture by university classes.

Where we belong is in the vital arena of serving up inspiration to artists coming along the pike, and presenting works from present and past with on going traveling exhibitions that can tour the world.

We invite you to partner with us in waking up our community to the importance and value of the erotic arts culture.

THE TOM OF FINLAND LEGACY

MILLIONS recognize Tom's artwork for his distinctive style, even as it changed and evolved over several decades. From the '50s to the '90s, it's pretty easy – even for casual fans – to spot a work by Tom.

Fun, playful, and seductive, Tom's "dirty little drawings" – as he called them – were surpris-

ingly powerful.

For gay men, he completely shattered the mythology of his time: that being gay meant being passive, guilty, and ashamed. There is a joy to Tom's works that expressed his own beliefs in sexuality, and opened the doors of invitation for others to join him.

Students of Tom's works see his influential presence still active today in the arts and in fashion, but most importantly in continuing to eliminate boundaries that never should have

existed in the first place.

As a man of his time, Tom's early art broke stereotypes. Some might say that he created the über male, macho image that became its own stereotype. But following Tom's evolution, it becomes less and less of the massive phalluses that became a hallmark, and more of an exploration of masculinity itself. His iconic

work *Day and Night* perhaps best captures the mood of his later years. In a business suit or rough edged, there is an intense sexuality that becomes every man. Leather is seductive, but not mandatory. Although he created the quintessential leather image, Tom also saw beyond it.

His Foundation, now over a quarter of a century young, furthers Tom's legacy. The mainstream acceptance of erotic artwork hasn't changed significantly in the two decades since his passing. Few businesses and organizations nurture the upcoming and existing generations of erotic artists. Fewer still, archive works from the past that would otherwise end up in the dust bin of history.

If you are fortunate enough to attend the Fair today – our 15th in Los Angeles – you will experience the vibrancy of today's artists. The work, time and expense in providing this outlet for artists is just one of the ways the Foundation lives up to its mission statement: "To Protect, Preserve, and Promote the Erotic Arts".
















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
